
In an interview on Friday, Mwanza DHO medical officer Francis Makiya said the items will enhance the fight against the Covid-19 pandemic in the district.

hand sanitisers and face masks which are expected to be distributed to the district's four health facilities, namely, Mwanza, Kunenekude, Thambani and Tulonkhondo.

The items are also expected to be distributed to some secondary and primary schools, Mwanza Boma and Chipatala

Market.

The donation has come through The European Union Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid Project being implemented in the district.
